## Construction Manager?

Construction managers manage the construction of a range of projects, including public infrastructure like roads and bridges, as well as buildings and homes. They also manage the people involved in construction, such as builders, contractors, and other trades and professionals.

## What does the job involve?

- **Reviewing Organising** builders, and the purchase and delivery of materials, plant and equipment
- **Working** with other building professionals and trades, including architects, engineers and technical workers
- **Negotiating** with building owners, property developers and subcontractors to make sure projects are completed on time and on budget
- **Preparing** contract bids to win new work
- **Making** sure workers follow building legislation and standards of performance, quality, cost and safety
- **Overseeing** the work of subcontractors
- **Organising** the submission of building plans and arranging building inspections by local authorities

## How do I get into this career?

Workers normally need at least five years of relevant onsite experience, usually as a qualified tradesperson, combined with a Diploma level qualification. Further study is also viewed as beneficial.
