



What is a Cabinet Maker?

A cabinet maker is a specialist woodworker who performs a range of skills associated with the manufacture and installation of kitchen and bathroom cabinets and fittings to new or renovation work.

What does the job involve?

- **Plan** kitchen and bathroom projects
- **Make** measurements and calculations
- **Use** hand and power tools
- **Determine** requirements for installation of cabinets
- **Install** fitted cabinets and components
- **Conduct** on-site adjustments to cabinets and components

How do I get into this career?

The most common pathway is via an apprenticeship. However, a cabinet maker can start as a trade assistant or labourer, then, after a few years, have their skills assessed through a process called Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) to get a trade qualification.
