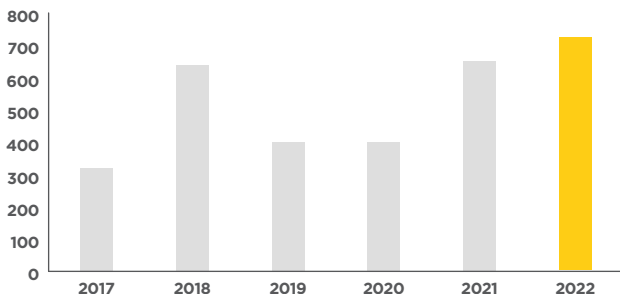

Building approvals

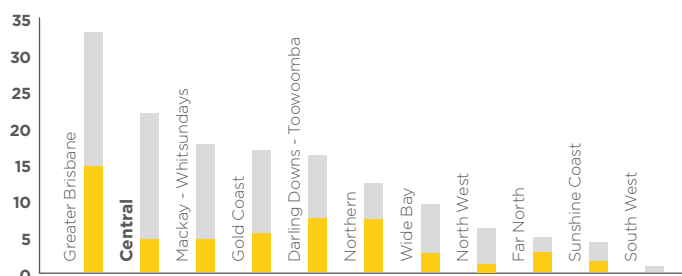
Value of building approvals (\$m), 12 months to June

Value of major projects

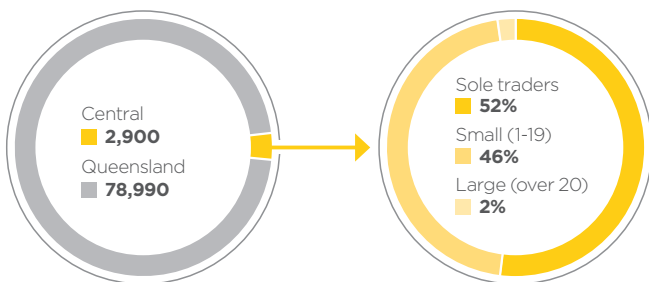
Value of **committed** major projects (\$b)

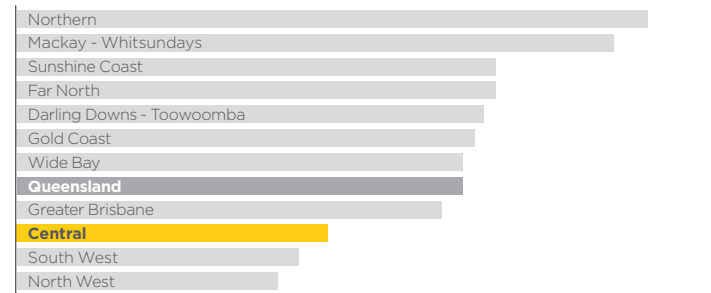

Apprentice training rate

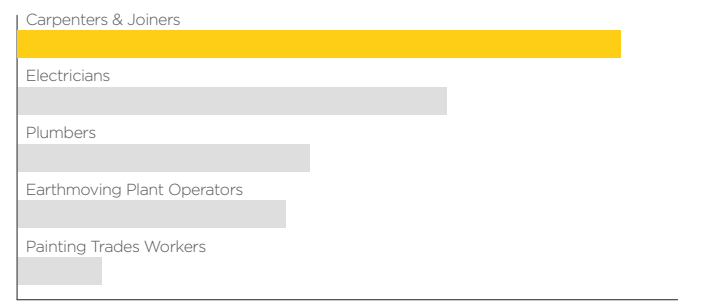
Construction apprentices in-training per hundred workers
